#### I. UO Core Education

All Bachelor of Arts students must complete two writing courses and a Cultural Literacy requirement comprised of one course from Global Perspectives (GP) and one course from US: Difference, Inequality, Agency (US). They must also complete fifteen credits in each of three Areas of Inquiry: Arts and Letters, Science, and Social Science. For a list of approved courses, visit classes.uoregon.edu. Students are advised to choose an Art History course (as listed in the Specific Major Requirements section below) which also counts as an Arts & Letters (>1) course. Each Area of Inquiry must have at least one course in a different subject code. You may only use three courses total in the same subject code across all three Areas of Inquiry.

### Bachelor of Arts Language Requirement: \*BA recommended.

The B.A. Foreign Language requirement may be met by satisfactory completion (C-/P or better) of at least the third term, second year of a foreign language course taught in the language; **OR** an examination administered by the appropriate department, showing language competence equivalent to that attained at the end of two years of college study. *Courses applied toward the B.A. Foreign Language requirement will not also count toward Areas of Inquiry requirements.* 

For students whose native language is not English: This requirement may be met by satisfactory completion of WR 121 and either WR 122 or 123. Students must provide an official high school or college transcript as evidence of previous formal education in a foreign language. See the Registrar's Office for clearance.

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### Bachelor of Science Requirement

One year of college-level coursework in Mathematics and/or Computer Science. See UO Catalog under "Bachelor of Science Requirements," your degree audit report, and/or consult an Academic Advisor to determine your requirement. Appropriate coursework is marked with ">4" or ">5" in the Schedule of Classes. These courses may not double count as Areas of Inquiry requirements.

#### **Checkpoint for Major Continuation:**

Submit research paper and unofficial transcript to the musicology faculty; complete an interview with a member of that faculty; complete WR 121 and the Music Core with a grade of C- or better.

To establish that satisfactory progress is being made in the History and Culture concentration of the Music major, students must successfully complete the major coursework with a grade of C- or better in the required courses. In anticipation of their senior portfolio, students should identify at least one completed final course project that might form part of this portfolio before their senior year. For questions about your progress through the concentration, please see the undergraduate music advisor.

#### **IV. Senior Portfolio**

All History and Culture majors must compile a portfolio of completed work for approval by at least two area faculty members. Submission of the portfolio must coincide with or follow one term of MUS 499: Senior Project. The portfolio should contain the equivalent of four pieces of completed work, roughly equivalent to 45 pages of material, *unified through a statement of purpose*. These may be a combination of polished term papers, recorded lecture-performances, blogs/websites, other media for public consumption, or simply a thesis. Students should be in consultation with their MUS 499 instructor to ensure that the portfolio meets the standard of quality required for the major.

#### V. Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 180 total credits earned.
